

## **Bloodroot (Wildflower)**



- Size: 7 20" tall
- Flowers late April to early May with 8-12 delicate white petals. Member of the poppy family.
- Does not bear fruit.
- Underground stem bleeds a reddish sap used long ago as an insect repellant, also as a cure for coughs and skin diseases.
- Native Americans used the sap as a dye for clothing, basket making, in art and as war paint.
- Grows in woodland areas, shade to partial shade, in moist to medium soils.
